Get a Head Start on Your Nursing Career Today.



Become an Undergraduate Nurse Employee and get paid work experience before you graduate!

Put your education and knowledge into practice working alongside health care teams in a medical, surgical, mental health, rehabilitation, chronic care or transitional care setting.

As an Undergraduate Nurse Employees (UNE), you will work under the supervision of Registered Nurses (RN) or Registered Psychiatric Nurses (RPN) caring for patients, gaining valuable experience, and logging work hours that will give you an advantage applying for jobs after you graduate.

Eligibility Requirements:

- Are you a third- or fourth-year nursing student enrolled in an approved Manitoba education program that will lead to practice as an RN or RPN?
 - Have you completed a minimum of 450 hours of clinical practice?
 - Was your clinical placement clinical placement in medicine, surgery or mental health on an inpatient unit?
- If you answered yes to all of the above, apply to become a UNE

The Opportunity

- Gain experience working in medicine, surgery or mental health, where you will put your education into practice, and strengthen your nursing knowledge and skills.
- Count your hours worked toward your seniority, and get a competitive advantage post- graduation.
- Earn a competitive salary starting at \$28 per hour.
- Vacation and statutory holiday pay will be earned on each cheque.
- Work casual positions with a combination of day, evening and weekend shifts, and no night shifts.
- Pick up additional shifts on short notice, potentially up to full-time during summer and the winter holiday season.
