Expand your horizons with the Manitoba Nephrology Nursing Course (MNNC).

The Opportunity:

This course will provide you with information about the renal program, support your baseline knowledge of chronic kidney disease, its causes and complications.

MNNC graduates have a guaranteed position and supported by an interdisciplinary team as they support essential patient care.

Enjoy flexibility in your schedule with day and evening shifts available and no nights required. Choose from 8-hour and 12-hour rotations.

How it works:

- Guaranteed Job as a Renal Health Nurse: You will apply directly to your preferred unit/facility.
- Accessible Education: The program blends online and classroom learning following by hands-on experience through a specialized preceptorship in the unit where you will work upon graduation. Rural and northern applicants will be given the option to travel to Winnipeg for in-person classroom learning.
- Comprehensive Training: With six weeks of classroom or online learning followed by 120 hours working alongside a preceptor, you will be equipped with the skills you need to work in this specialized environment, with support each step of the way.
- Paid Training: You will be paid a full-time salary* throughout your comprehensive training. Salary commensurate with the Manitoba Nurses Union (MNU) N2 salary scale.





Working in hemodialysis really improves your skills: from assessment to critical thinking and response time, to managing many aspects of acuity and chronic health conditions with multiple patients at the same time.

Learning how to problem solve independently and as a member of a bigger team is a skill that is definitely built here and is transferable to any health setting.

- To sign up for the MNNC, you will apply directly to the Renal Unit where you wish to work. A minimum of one year of acute clinical care experience within the last three years is preferred.
- Once hired, you must successfully complete the Manitoba Nephrology Nursing Course Pre-Training Exam. This
 course will provide you with information about the renal program, support your baseline knowledge of chronic
 kidney disease, its causes and complications. A passing grade of 70 per cent is well within reach and valid for a
 one-year period.
- If you already have Nephrology Training or have worked in a renal unit in the last five years, apply for a Nurse
 position at the site of your choice.
