Build your future, in a place that feels like home



Celebrate the Beautiful Cultures That Make up Manitoba


Manitoba is a multicultural province with events highlighting Filipino culture and plenty of the other diverse communities that call Manitoba home.


In Winnipeg, visit the polar bears at The Journey to Churchill, located at Assiniboine Park Zoo and connect with nature and get a view of Manitoba bison at Fort Whyte Alive, one of our many large urban green spaces. Visit one of our many art galleries, music and cultural festivals and museums, including the Canadian Museum for Human Rights, the largest in North America.

Within a short drive from Winnipeg you'll find spectacular northern lights dancing in the sky and lakes for reeling in greenback walleye, sturgeon and catfish in Lockport. Head to Whiteshell Provincial Park to walk through the centuries-old Indigenous cultural site, or head north to experience a traditional Indigenous way of life: dog sledding.

Manitoba's spectacular wilderness is preserved and enjoyed thanks to 92 provincial parks, 15 provincial forests, and 2 national parks – Riding Mountain National Park and Wapusk National Park.

Plus, Manitoba has two million hectares of protected landscapes and a UNESCO World Heritage Site.







Immigration Information

Once you've received and accepted a job offer to come work in Manitoba, the Manitoba Provincial Nominee Program (MPNP) will send you an invitation to apply (ITA) by email.

STEP 1

Create Online Government of Manitoba Single Sign On profile and submit an MPNP Expression of Interest (EOI) profile

- The EOI is a questionnaire-based profile, you will be asked several questions.
- Ensure you identify your MPNP ITA code.
- EOI profiles containing a valid ITA code will be issued a Letter of Advice to Apply (LAA) during an MPNP EOI draw.

STEP 2

Submit your MPNP application

- You will use your LAA to submit a complete application, including all documents for you and your dependants, and pay the application fee.*
- You must submit your complete MPNP application within 60 days of receiving the LAA.

STEP 3

Complete applications receive full MPNP assessment

- MPNP Skilled Worker applicants are nominated or refused based on program criteria.
- Successful applicants will receive a certificate of nomination and work permit support letter.

STEP 4

Submit the work permit and completed permanent residence applications to the federal department of Immigration Refugees and Citizenship Canada (IRCC)

- As applications for permanent residence and work permits are different processes, the federal department of IRCC will assess these applications separately.
- Your work permit application will require an approved police clearance certificate and medical exam.

STEP 5

IRCC approves the Work Permit application

- Come to Manitoba to begin working as a temporary resident while your application for permanent residence is in process.
- Your eligible dependants may accompany you and can apply for work and study permits.

Incentives

Nurses who are successful applicants will receive a conditional offer of employment and opportunity to relocate to Manitoba to complete the next steps in the credentialing and licensing process.

Upon acceptance of the conditional offer, nurses will be eligible for support, orientation and mentorship, including the following incentives:



PAID TRAVEL

Paid travel to Manitoba.



PAID LICENSING

Paid credentialing and licensing.



ACCOMMODATION ALLOWANCE

Access to an accommodation and settlement allowance, for a period of up to three months.



IMMIGRATION SUPPORT

Paid immigration support and guidance throughout your move to Manitoba.



WORKPLACE ONBOARDING

Workplace onboarding, orientation and buddled mentorship.



PAID PROGRAMMING

Access to paid programming, when additional educational bridging is required.
